Year R will be learning this half term through the topic **Minibeasts**



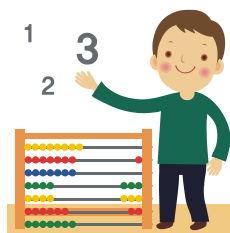
Mathematical Development
